

Recommendation T/R 21-03 (Puerto de la Cruz 1974)**DEFINITION OF CERTAIN EXPRESSIONS USED IN ASSIGNING FREQUENCIES
IN THE LAND MOBILE SERVICE**

Recommendation proposed by the "Radiocommunications" Working Group T/WG 3 (R)

Text of the Recommendation adopted by the "Telecommunications" Commission:

"The European Conference of Postal and Telecommunications Administrations,

considering

- (a) that it is of great importance to define clearly the terms used in the assigning of frequencies so that texts will not be interpreted differently by the different Administrations,
- (b) that, in the absence of such definitions relating to this field, it falls to the CEPT to draw up its own for use in its own texts,
- (c) that, in the land mobile service, assigned frequencies can vary widely in status,

recommends

that the following expressions be used in CEPT texts concerning the land mobile service with the precise meanings given below:

1. Exclusive frequency (in French: fréquence exclusive; in German: Exklusivfrequenz)
An exclusive frequency is a frequency allocated to the stations of a single user in a specific location or service zone taking into account the density of occupancy and the quality of the service to be obtained.
2. Common frequency (fréquence commune in French and Gemeinschaftsfrequenz in German)
A common frequency is a frequency allocated to the stations of several users in the same location or in the same service zone, taking into account the density of occupancy and the quality of the service to be obtained. Users may have activities of the same or of a different nature.
3. Collective frequency (fréquence collective in French and Sammelfrequenz in German)
A collective frequency is a frequency allocated to the stations of several users in a determined service zone or throughout their national territory, without taking into account the density of occupation or the quality of the service."
